Cungelella Art Collective, made up of four sisters from Mount Isa in North-west Queensland – Jaunita Doyle, Dale Bruce, Glenda McCulloch, and Cheryl Perez—are artists and Kalkadoon women. Through their art, they share the stories of their Kalkatungu homelands, using vibrant colours, rich textures, and the deep history of their heritage.

Their collective, Cungelella Art, captures the essence of Kalkadoon country with earthy tones of greens, browns, soft oranges, and pinks, inspired by the land. Today, they combine this knowledge with a contemporary take on Aboriginal art, reflecting the rugged landscapes, native flora, and the beautiful colors of their homeland.



As the sun sets on Kalkatungu Country, the land glows with golden light, sweeping over the rugged hills and casting long shadows across ancient rocks. Soft oranges blend into pinks and purples, as if nature is painting a tribute to those who came before. The sky feels almost sacred, filling the land with calm and peace.

For the Kalkatungu people, this scene is deeply meaningful, showing their strong connection to Country.
